This Quest program is unique in many ways. One important distinction is its larger context of being a program created for Unitarian Universalists. An important characteristic of our religious movement is our strong belief that we are all on a journey, all setting out on new paths each day, yet we do not assert that we must all take the same path. We believe that each person must find the road that fits with his or her worldview, his or her own integrity, and life experiences.

This program is based on the fundamental belief that the "free and responsible search for truth and meaning" affirmed in our Unitarian Universalist Principles is a spiritual search. We are each on a journey, and when that journey is with others, we are challenged and supported to go further and deeper than we would have ever been able to go alone.

Spiritual Companions

Each Quest participant will be partnered with a Spiritual Companion, a person considered by the Quest leadership to have specific skills, wisdom, and maturity, particularly highly developed interpersonal skills and a willingness to spend the time necessary to provide support to someone else.

Participants will schedule monthly meetings with their Spiritual Companion starting September, 2016, at their mutual convenience.

Integration Groups

west participants will be organized into two small groups which will meet monthly on the 2nd Monday of the months that do not have retreats, beginning, October 10, 2016, from 6-9pm. Meetings will begin with a large group potluck before separating into the two Integration Groups which will be facilitated by Leslie Miller and Mark Zimmerer.

Since membership in each group will be stable throughout *Quest*, relationships among members have the opportunity to grow, offer supportive "holding" for, and bear witness to each other's individual journeys. Careful attention has been given to the design of the integration groups with an invitation to move from the outside "busy" world into a slower- paced, contemplative one, allowing the mind to quiet and the heart to open.
